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Together, we can seek *dayenu* moments that make our Jewish community safer, more respectful, and equitable for all.

If only we strive towards compassion and integrity in how we talk, work, and behave with each other. **Dayenu** 

If only we act as upstanders and allies, crying out against misconduct, harassment, and bullying. **Dayenu** 

If only we find the courage to speak up against injustice, discrimination, toxic power structures, sexism, racism, and antisemitism. **Dayenu** 

If only we remember that we are all created in the image of the Divine. Dayenu

It would be enough, but only when *each of us* does our part to pursue true justice, inclusion, and respect for all.
